



## Woodward Copper Camp Tuition Protection Plan

### **Camp Tuition Protection Plan Benefits**

At Woodward Copper, we strive to help our guests plan their visit with ease and peace of mind. We understand that people get sick and injuries happen that can cause our guests to cancel or delay their camp. The purpose of Woodward Copper's Protection Plan ("WWPP") is to reduce the impact of negative circumstances that befall our guests. Woodward Copper will refund your prepaid deposits, less the fee for this plan, if the participant's guest's summer camp is impacted due to the reasons listed below. Woodward Copper will refund partial tuition payments made for unused portions of summer camp if participant's camp is interrupted due to the reasons listed below.

### **Eligibility**

A guest who purchases a Woodward Copper Summer Camp and who has paid the WWPP fee 24 hours prior to the unforeseen event (see covered reasons below) is eligible for protection under this plan. If another camp week is desired by the guest, the option of the WWPP will be offered at the time of reservation and purchase. The Woodward Camp Protection Plan cost is 7% (seven percent) of the total amount of the camp reservation.

### **Effective Date**

Reservation cancellation or interruption benefits will be effective on the date the fee is paid and will terminate on the date your camp reservation is canceled.

### **Request for Refund Procedure**

If prior to the start date of the camp session check-in, you must contact Woodward Copper immediately to report the reason why your camp participant will not be attending his/her session by calling 970-968-2318 x60833 and leaving a detailed voicemail. If the reason for cancelling is a covered reason, you will need to provide written documentation describing why you are cancelling the session. You must also provide written documentation from the doctor/hospital, police authority, department of transportation, human resources department of reserving guest's or traveling companion's place of employment, or home insurance provider. Once received, Woodward Copper will review and issue a credit to the credit card used (unless otherwise noted upon the initial report of cancellation) in full, less the cost of the WWPP. If any information is false or omitted, Woodward Copper reserves the right to reject the refund.

If covered incident occurs during camp, you must submit the same written documentation as listed above which Woodward Copper will review. If approved we will issue a credit to the credit card used (unless otherwise noted) as a pro-rated refund depending the day of the week the covered incident occurred, less the cost of the WWPP. If any information is false or omitted, Woodward Copper reserves the right to reject the refund.

### **Coverage Details**

Woodward Copper will refund your unused portions of your camp as detailed on your reservation confirmation, less the WWPP fee if the camp is delayed, cancelled or interrupted due to any of the following and Woodward Copper is notified immediately:

- Unforeseeable sickness, injury or death of the participant, traveling companion or family member. Woodward Copper must be notified within 48 hours of doctor/hospital visit or death.
- Loss of employment of the reserving guest after date of WWPP reservation confirmation, if employed for six consecutive months or longer with the same employer. Length of employment and termination date must be verifiable & documentation provided by Human Resource department. Woodward Copper must be notified within 48 hours of loss of employment.
- Medical reasons that are not pre-existing, as certified by a doctor/hospital. Woodward Copper must be notified within 48 hours of doctor/hospital visit.
- Deployment for armed forces service (camper or parent/guardian). Woodward Copper must be notified within one week prior to registered camp.
- Road or airport closures due to bad weather that delays trip over 12 hours. Woodward Copper must be notified within 12 hours of announced closure.
- Air or ground transportation caused delays that affect public transportation. Woodward Copper must be notified within 12 hours of announced closure.
- Primary residence of reserving guest is made uninhabitable by fire, flood or other natural disaster. Woodward Copper must be notified within 48 hours of home becoming uninhabitable.

### **Exclusions**

These exclusions apply to all benefits. WWPP will not cover loss of deposit due to

cancellation or interruption caused by:

- Scheduling conflicts such as sports, work-related functions, family events, vacations, etc.
  
- Any unlawful acts, committed by the participant, reserving guest or traveling companion. This includes violation of one or more of the Big No's. These can also be found on page 7 of the pre-arrival packet.
  1. No to the use and/or possession of alcohol, drugs, tobacco, any other illegal or inappropriate substance, hazardous or combustible materials and items including but not limited to weapons or any kinds, firearms, knives, mace, lighters, matches, candles, fireworks, incense, etc. Any items that are found will be confiscated and result in calls to parents/legal guardians and appropriate law enforcement officials (if warranted).
  2. No fighting, aggressive, threatening or bullying behavior, or harassment of any sort (including sexual harassment, i.e., unwanted advances toward other campers, employees, or Copper Mountain Resort guests).
  3. No leaving camp boundaries as depicted on the Camp Map. This includes going into off limits buildings, leaving rooms at night, stepping foot on the Summit Stage or going anywhere without permission from a Camp Manager or Camp Supervisor. For your reference a Woodward Copper Camp Map is enclosed and available online. There is to be no hitchhiking within or outside of camp boundaries.
  4. No stealing. Any items that are found will be confiscated and result in calls to parents and appropriate law enforcement officials (if warranted).
  5. No graffiti or vandalism of any kind.
  6. NO swearing or offensive language
  
- A desire to no longer attend camp for any reason.
  
- Declared or undeclared war, or any act of war or terrorism.

### **Definitions**

**“Accident”** means an unexpected, unintended, unforeseeable event causing injury. The Accident must happen while the Reserving Guest is covered by WWPP.

**“Doctor”** means a licensed practitioner of the healing arts, acting within the scope of his/her license. The treating Doctor may not be the Reserving Guest, Family Member or Traveling Companion.

**“Hospital”** means a place that: (a) holds a valid license; (b) is run mainly for the care and treatment of sick or injured persons as inpatients; (c) has a staff of one or more Doctors available at all times.

**“Injury”** is a bodily injury, caused by an Accident and resulting directly and independently of all other causes. The Injury must happen while the Reserving Guest is covered under WWPP and must require treatment by a Doctor.

**“Reserving Guest”** means the person who made the reservation or the guest who will be participating in Woodward Copper Summer Camp

**“Sickness”** means an illness or disease which requires treatment by a Doctor.

**“Traveling Companion”** is a person named as accompanying the Reserving Guest to/during/from Woodward Copper Summer Camp.

**“Unused Portions”** means days missed at camp due to the covered reasons listed in section “Coverage Details.” A camp day begins at 7:30am and ends at 9:00pm Monday thru Friday. A camp week is Sunday thru Saturday morning.
